the third and final volume of continuum s set on the history of world theater all the world s a stage yet the multicultural dimension of the american continent s stage remained an untold story until felicia londr and daniel watermeier raised the curtain on the entire north american theatrical scene this volume

will fascinate scholar student and casual reader alike with some 300 illustrations many rare and previously unpublished an extensive index and separate bibliographies for each historical period this volume is the perfect companion for anyone interested in the theater

theater has often served as a touchstone for critical moments of political change or national definition steve wilmer selects key historical moments in american history to examine the theater s response the selected events range from the colonial fight for independence through native american struggles the socialist worker play and the civil rights movement to those of the last decade wilmer also considers audience reception and critical response

as america passed from a mere venue for english plays into a country with its own nationally regarded playwrights william dunlap lived the life of a pioneer on the frontier of the fledgling american theatre full of adventures mishaps and close calls he adapted and translated plays for the american audience and wrote plays of his own as well learning how theatres and theatre companies operated from the inside out dunlap s masterpiece a history of american theatre was the first of its kind drawing on the author s own experiences in it he describes the development of theatre in new york philadelphia and south carolina as well as congress s first attempts at theatrical censorship never before previously indexed this edition also includes a new introduction by tice l miller

this is an authoritative and wide ranging history of american theatre in all its dimensions from theatre building to playwriting directors performers and designers engaging the theatre as a performance art a cultural institution and a fact of american social and political life the history addresses the economic context that conditioned the drama presented the history approaches its subject with a full awareness of relevant developments in literary criticism cultural analysis and performance theory at the same time it is designed to be an accessible challenging narrative all volumes include an extensive overview and timeline followed by chapters on specific aspects of theatre volume three examines the development of the theatre after world war ii through the productions of broadway and beyond and into regional theatre across the country contributors also analyze new directions in theatre design directing and acting as well as key plays and playwrights through the 1990s

international in scope this book is designed to be the pre eminent reference work on the english speaking theatre in the twentieth century arranged alphabetically it consists of some 2500 entries written by 280 contributors from 20 countries which include not only top level experts but uniquely leading professionals from the world of theatre a fascinating resource for anyone interested in theatre it includes overviews of major concepts topics and issues surveys of theatre institutions countries and genres biographical entries on key performers playwrights directors designers choreographers and composers articles by leading professionals on crafts skills and disciplines including acting design directing lighting sound and voice

performing america provides fresh perspectives on the development of visions of both america and america that is the actual community and the constructed concept on a variety of theatrical stages it explores the role of theater in the construction of american identity highlighting the tension between the desire to categorize american identity and the realization that such categorical uniformity may neither be desirable nor possible the topics covered include the links between politics and the stage during the federalist period the appropriation of indian artifacts an exploration of early gender roles and the

metaphorical connections between the theater and western expansion other essays treat vaudeville s artistically colonized cultures chautauqua s attempt to homogenize culture and commercialize american ideals w e b du bois s pageant the star of ethiopia as a strategy for constructing african american as other in an attempt to promote a vision of black nationalism and how theater was used to help immigrants form a new sense of community while joining the resident culture the collection then turns to questions of how various ethnic minorities through their recent theatrical work have struggled to argue their identities especially in relation to the dominant white culture two final essays offer critiques of contrasting aspects of the american male throughout the collection addresses questions of marginality and community exclusion and inclusion colonialism and imperialism heterogeneity and homogeneity conflict and negotiation repression and opportunity failure and success and above all the relationship of american stages at large it will appeal to readers of a wide range of disciplines including history american culture gender studies and theater studies jeffrey d mason is professor of theatre california state university bakersfield j ellen gainor is associate professor of theatre studies and women s studies cornell university
